## Notes:

- Of the 207 filled CSHO positions, there are 13 Senior Safety Engineer (SSE) positions in District Offices. The SSEs are to spend 50% of their time on District Office administrative matters and 50% of their time conducting compliance inspections. The number of CSHOs available for field inspections is 200.5 CSHOs.
- The 35 vacant CSHO positions include 3 Senior Safety Engineer (SSE) positions in District Offices. Because SSE positions can only be filled by internal promotion, current Safety Engineers/compliance officers will be promoted and the resulting 3 CSHO vacancies will need to be backfilled.
- DOSH has a vacancy rate for CSHO positions of 14.5% (35 vacancies in 242 positions).

- The California Employment Development Department (EDD) reported the Californian civilian labor force in May 2016 as 19,075,800 workers.
- The 200.5 field-available filled CSHO positions represents an inspector to worker ratio of 1 inspector to 95,141 workers.
- Cal/OSHA's inspector to worker ratio of 1 inspector to 95,000 workers is much less health protective than Fed OSHA's ratio of 1 to 59,000; Washington State's ratio of 1 to 25,000; and Oregon's ratio of 1 to 22,000. [These non-California ratios were cited in the Department of Industrial Relations' Budget Change Proposal of January 2015.]
- The 200.5 field-available CSHO positions are also below the number of California Fish & Game Wardens (250) currently working in the field.
- The 200.5 field-available CSHO positions also include 18 CSHOs who are in training (SET, TAU, T&D, Junior SE) and do not conduct independent inspections alone.
- The Fremont District Office has a vacancy in the District Manager position, which means that either a District Office CSHO or a Region I staff member must be the office-bound Acting District Manager.

The are only 30 field CSHOs who receive bilingual pay after passing a proficiency exam in speaking languages other than English are listed below. It is estimated that 5 million of the state's 19 million worker labor force speak languages other than English, with many monolingual in their native tongue.
