- The 170 filled CSHO positions above include 8 CSHOs who are in training (SET, TAU, T&D, Junior SE) and do not conduct independent inspections alone.
- Republican Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger had 195 filled CSHO positions in Regions I through VI in January 2011 when he left office. In calendar year 2000, DOSH had 200 filled CSHO positions.
- The 170 currently filled CSHO positions represents an inspector to worker ratio of 1 inspector to 106,286 workers for California's 18.6 million civilian labor force.
- The Cal/OSHA inspector to worker ratio is worse than Fed OSHA's ratio of 1 to 66,000, Washington state's ratio of 1 to 33,000 and Oregon's ratio of 1 to 28,000.
- It is also below the number of California Fish & Game wardens (253) in the field in November 2013.
