- Of the 195 filled CSHO positions, there are 12 Senior Safety Engineer (SSE) positions in District Offices. The SSEs are to spend 50% of their time on District Office administrative matters and 50% of their time conducting compliance inspections. In addition, there are five "Retired Annuitant" (RA) rehired staff working as CSHOs in District Offices. RA positions are temporary, part-time positions. RAs are limited to 960 hours per fiscal year (half time).
- Therefore, the number of CSHOs available for field inspections is 191.5 CSHOs.
- There are 65 vacant CSHO positions. DOSH has a vacancy rate for CSHO positions of 25% (65 vacancies in 260 positions).
- There are **three District Offices without a District Manager**: Long Beach, San Francisco and Van Nuys. In these District Offices, a CSHO must serve as Acting District Manager, so those offices effectively have one additional CSHO vacancy as the ADMs do not conduct field inspections. One of the three SSE/District Manager positions in Mining & Tunneling (Region V) are vacant.
- Some enforcement District Offices are particularly hard hit: Fremont has 7 of 11 CSHO positions vacant (64%); and both Oakland and Fresno have 4 of 12 positions vacant (33%). Overall, Region I (San Francisco Bay Area) has a CSHO vacancy rate of 35%. Three District Offices (American Canyon, Sacramento and HHU Oakland) have zero clerical staff, which means CSHOs must spend time doing the admin work.
- The California Employment Development Department (EDD) reported the Californian civilian labor force in July 2022 as 19,239,800 workers. The 191.5 field-available filled CSHO positions represents an inspector to worker ratio of 1 inspector to 100,468 workers. Cal/OSHA's inspector to worker ratio of 1 inspector to 100,000 workers is much less health protective than Washington State's ratio of 1 to 28,000, and Oregon's ratio of 1 to 24,000. [These non-California ratios were cited in the 2020 "Death on the Job" report.]
- In 1980, Federal OSHA had a ratio of 14.8 CSHOs per million workers. Forty-two years later, Cal/OSHA has a ratio of 10.0 CSHOs per million workers.
- The 191.5 field-available CSHO positions are also below the number of California Fish & Game Wardens (approximately 250) currently working in the field.
- The 191.5 field-available CSHO positions also include five CSHOs who are in training (SET, TAU, T&D, Junior SE) and usually do not conduct independent inspections alone.

Additional Note:

As of April 2022, there are only 21 field CSHOs who receive bilingual pay, after passing a proficiency exam in speaking languages other than English, as listed below. It is estimated that 5 million of the state's 19 million worker labor force speak languages other than English, with many monolingual in their native tongue.
